## EVANGELIUM LIVE: John 13:31-33a.34-35

"This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

I enjoy reading interviews or listening to podcasts with the topic of relationships. I think relationships are a skill I'm still learning, so I'm grateful for any new ideas in this area. In one of them it was said that one of the biggest challenges of parenthood is not to lose love for the one with whom we have children. From my five years of parenting experience so far, I have to say that taking care of any relationship, whether it is a partnership, friendship, intergenerational relationships in the family, or even a personal relationship with God, was (and still often is) a really big challenge for me.

Time seems to pass about a hundred times faster with the kids, sometimes I feel like I'm just fluttering along with life. And in the cycle of parenting responsibilities, tiredness and endless to-do lists, I often lose myself and there is no energy, time, determination or patience left to nurture relationships to keep them high-quality and vivid. I have to admit that this surprised me about parenting. For a long time I felt guilty about not being a good enough wife, friend, sister, daughter, lay-associated... However, thanks to my "self-study of relationships" I have come to understand that, like everything in parenting, it is just a phase that I have to accept humbly and that the time of nurturing

relationships will come again.



At the end of last year, I told myself that relationships would be my theme for the upcoming year, that I would consciously focus on taking care of them. I still wish I had more energy and time to do it, but I compensate with determination and hopefully patience. And after a long time, I notice that it is not just self-denial and hard work for me, but that it brings me pure joy. At the same time, I recognize that relationships can be my testimony in today's world, my personal mission that I am called to do right now.
